Mariah also worked as a United States House of Representatives Page in Washington, D.C., where she gained invaluable experience assisting the Members of Congress on the House Floor during debates and votes.

Prior to attending law school, Mariah graduated summa cum laude from Finlandia University in Hancock, Michigan with a Bachelor of Arts (Liberal Studies) with concentrations in History, Political Science, and Corporate Communications. While at Finlandia, Mariah was an active member of the NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Team and NCAA Women's Golf Team.
